- 2. Affordable Housing
- 3. Improve City Policies &Plans
- 4. Improve Communication, Transparency & Efficiency
- 5. City Budget & the Impact of taxes
- 6. Support Schools, Libraries, Small Businesses & Diversity
- 7. Public Safety & Crime
- 8. More Funded Programs for Youth Development, Culture & Arts
- 9. Improvement on Traffic, Parking Rules, Public Transportation, Streets, Sidewalks & Street Lighting
- 10. Community Involvement
